Good afternoon!

Last week I wrote about some of the challenges to begin the year. While they still exist, this week I want to share celebrations. First, we had our first allschool Mass today. It was outdoors and the weather couldn't have been better. We plan to have another outdoor Mass next week to kick off the theme for the year: Pray and Work. Thanks to Mrs. Staverman, Father Bach, Mr. Tieman and everyone for helping with our outdoor Mass.

Additionally, teachers are once again meeting in teams to align between grade level homerooms and with grade levels above and below the grade they teach. Teaching can be a very isolating profession because once the door is closed it's the teacher with a group of hungry-to-learn pupils, so it's important to have meetings together. We have excellent teachers that are dedicated to filling our children's minds.

This week's COVID update includes an additional positive student, several COVID concerns that have fortunately led to negative tests and minimal quarantines. We have not seen as many positive cases or quarantines as we have during the first two weeks of school, but there has been much time invested in tracking details. Each case is addressed on an individual basis to ensure that we have all the necessary information.

This time last year we didn't have any positive student cases, but we did have more close contacts than we currently do. Comparing close contacts from last year to this year is not a direct comparison because the protocols are different.

Lastly, Vision Night is going to be adjusted this year. Instead of bringing everyone together on one night, we're going to bring groups of grades together at separate times. This is partially in an effort to minimize the number of people in one place at one time (adults don't always fit as well in student spaces) and partially to allow for families with multiple kids to more easily visit more grades.

Junior high Vision Night will remain this Wednesday, September 8 beginning at 6:30 PM. Kindergarten through fifth grade, look for more information from your homeroom teachers in the coming week or two.

Before you enjoy your long weekend, a couple reminders:

- our Mumkin sale is open until September 9. We've already raised over \$4,000 and plan to use that money for much needed teacher / student resources and material storage to keep from potential water damage.
- It's Skyline time this Tuesday.

Towards a Better Education of Children

The August 30 edition of the Diocese of Covington's newspaper, <u>The Messenger</u>, had an excellent article on the importance of following Pope Francis' post-synodal apostolic exhortation, "Amoris Laetitia — On Love in the Family" is

entitled "Towards a Better Education of Children." Kendra McGuire, Superintendent of Catholic Schools, and her family are featured in the article. Mrs. McGuire grew up in our parish and her parents are still members.

"As parents, we have to continue to make sure that children understand how important our faith is. One big thing that families need to do is pray together," said Mrs. McGuire. "Start the day with prayer, pray before meals, before bed; this helps children stay centered and recognize that they are called to give their entire day to God. Families need to make Mass a priority and understand that Sunday is a day to focus on God and your family."

In her own family, Mrs. McGuire makes sure that they all participate in activities together at the parish, such as Stations of the Cross or other ministries. During Advent they light an Advent wreath at their dinner table. "Any time we can be together with the larger faith community, we try to do that. And, any time we can bring the faith into the house, we try to do that," she said.






Fall Pictures
