Diocese of Covington Job Opportunities

The Diocese of Covington Curia offices are looking to replace valuable departing staff members, and we invite interested Catholic candidates to apply for these open positions. The **Messenger**, which is the official newspaper of the diocese and is mailed to over 29,000 Catholic families 44 times per year, will be hiring a *Staff Writer* who will also share duties as *Media Content Developer* for the diocesan website, social media, and potentially other venues and forums. The **Finance** office will be replacing our retiring *Benefits Coordinator*, who is key to our health benefits administration for lay employees and for priests. And the Catholic **Newman Center** at Northern Kentucky University will look for a successor to its beloved retiring *Campus Minister*. YES FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN

Diocesan parishes and schools are allowed to promote the Yes for Life Amendment. This is considered a lobbying activity, as opposed to political campaigns, under federal law. The proposed amendment does not create any new restrictions on abortion. It simply establishes that nothing in the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky can be interpreted to include a right to an abortion. In other words, it prevents a judge from imposing a statewide version of Roe v. Wade on the citizens of Kentucky. It provides that issues about abortion and the sanctity of human life will be decided in the state legislature and at the ballot box, not by a judge or court.

As we head into this year's fall political campaign season, we recall the obligation we have as Faithful Citizens to be participants in our nation's political process and to bring our values to the shaping of public policy. As we are taught in Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship,

every Catholic has a responsibility to be involved in political life:

In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation...[This obligation] is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person... As far as possible citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).

As Catholics we know that protecting the sanctity of life is not a political stance, but a fundamental and moral foundation.

Myth: The Yes for Life Amendment "will harm everyone, but the most vulnerable Kentuckians will suffer the worst effects."

Fact: The ProLife movement in Kentucky is dedicated to protecting the most vulnerable among us: the unborn. The Yes for Life Amendment will enshrine Kentucky values into our Constitution.

Myth: The Yes for Life Amendment will make Kentucky an outlier among other states.

Fact: Multiple states have added similar amendments to their state constitutions to protect the sanctity of life, including Tennessee, Alabama, West Virginia, and Louisiana.

Speaker: Addia K. Wuchner Executive Director of Kentucky Right to Life

St. Joseph Church, Crescent Springs, Kentucky, will host Addia K. Wuchner, the Executive Director of Kentucky Right to Life (KRLA). Addia, a Louisville native, served in the House of Representatives, District 66, for Boone County and Kentucky citizens from 2005 until 2019, where she championed the human rights of unborn children. She joined KRLA in January 2021.

Addia will address the following topics:

- · The work ahead for the Pro-Life movement in aftermath of Roe v. Wade
- · Kentucky's response: The "Yes for Life" Ballot Initiative
- The Frankfort rally for "Yes for Life," Saturday, October 1, 2-4 PM
- · What you can do to help pass this important initiative

Addia and KRLA are working jointly with the Catholic Conference of Kentucky to bring awareness to the importance of voting "Yes for Life." The Conference's Board of Directors consists of the Archbishop and Bishops of the four Roman Catholic dioceses in Kentucky: the Archdiocese of Louisville and the Dioceses of Covington, Lexington, and Owensboro.

Please note for anyone concerned that 501c3 entities, a category that includes churches, cannot advocate for a political candidate; however, ballet questions are not considered candidates under IRS rules.
