The Gaga Pit Returns!

You may have already noticed the octagonal structure located near the gym doors. It has been two years since the school's last gaga pit was in use and had to be removed due to deterioration and safety concerns. Planning for a new gaga pit began in March of 2023. Gaga is a fast-paced, high energy sport played in an octagonal pit. The more players, the better! Dubbed a kinder/gentler version of dodge ball, the game is played with a soft foam ball and combines the skills of dodging, striking, running, and jumping, while trying to hit opponents with a ball below the knees. Players need to keep moving to avoid getting hit by the ball. Fun and easy, and everyone gets a serious workout!

The new Gaga pit was assembled on Friday, August 18, and was in use later that afternoon as families began showing up to the CruClassic volleyball tournament. Owen Strothman from Boy Scout Troop 1 in Florence volunteered to do his Eagle Scout Service Project for St. Henry Catholic School, planning, designing, and constructing a new gaga pit for students to enjoy. As Owen's project description states, "the gaga pit will promote physical activity, teamwork, and sportsmanship for kids of all ages and skill levels during school recesses and evening/weekend activities in the gym." It is constructed with marine-grade, pressure-treated lumber, and has a primer coat of paint on it all for greater life span and a black foam floor mat to protect against injuries.

Owen is the son of Ryan and Lori Strothman of Florence and a senior at Ryle High School. The project was funded through the generosity of the St. Henry Men's Holy Name Society, our Athletic Boosters provided the flooring, as well as two private donors. Thank you, Owen Strothman and Boy Scout Troop 1 for your Eagle Scout Service Project that benefits our school with a new, safer, and longer-lasting gaga pit that St. Henry Catholic School students will enjoy for years to come!

The Most Precious Blood of Jesus



The oldest documents concerning the Holy Blood of Bruges date back to 1256. The Holy Blood probably was part of a group of relics of the Passion of Christ preserved at the imperial museum of Bucoleon in Constantinople (modern Istanbul). In 1203 Constantinople was besieged and conquered by the crusaders. Baldovin IX, Count of Flanders, after being crowned as the new emperor, sent the relic of the Precious Blood to his native country at Bruges.









ecent analyses were made on the crystal bortle containing the Holy Blood. The bortle has been dated as of the 11th century. It is also are it was made in an area near by Constantinople. Although in the Bible there is no explicit mention that the Blood of Christ was ever preserved, in one of the Apocryphal Gospels it is narrated that Joseph of Arimathea preserved some drops of the blood of Christ.

According to an ancient tradition Count Diederik van den Elzas

tradition. Count Diederik van den Elzas brought the bottle containing the Blood of Christ from Jerusalem to Bruges during the second crusade. Recent investigations however have pointed out that the relic arrived in Bruges at a later date, probably around 1250 coming from Constantinople. The veneration of the relic is at the origin of the internationally famous procession that is held every year through the streets of the city on the day of the Feast of the Ascension.

The citizens of Bruges dress in historical customs and reenact biblical scenes and the arrival of the Count of Flanders who brought the Holy relic.
