Resurrection Rolls

A favorite Holy Week tradition for our third and fourth graders is making Resurrection rolls! Here's a short explanation of this wonderful learning experience.

Ingredients/symbolism:

Large marshmallow (body of Jesus)

Crescent roll (the wrapping of Jesus' body or tomb)

Melted butter (oils of embalming)

Cinnamon and sugar mix (spices used to anoint Jesus' body)

Oven (tomb)

Cavity in the roll (the empty tomb)

After Jesus died on the cross, his body was prepared for burial according to the Jewish customs of the time (John 19:38-42). The children do this by dipping their marshmallows in the butter and then rolling them in cinnamon sugar.

Next, the rolls represent the tomb. The children put the marshmallow on the dough and roll it very tight. The tomb was heavily guarded and secure. The Romans put an enormous rock in front of the entrance to the tomb and assigned guards to keep watch outside (Matthew 27:62-66). It is impossible for a mere man to get out!

The rolls are then placed in the oven and explained that Jesus was in the tomb for three days (Matthew 12:40). (Bake crescent rolls according to directions on package.)

When the students open the resurrection rolls, the marshmallow is GONE! Just like

Jesus's body was no longer in the tomb when the women came to see him on Sunday! (Matthew 28:5-6)

What a beautiful tradition! Try this with your family this weekend!

BINGO Volunteers Needed!

Quick pull tab training:

- arrive at scheduled time
- head to the cafeteria
- go all the way to the back and sign in at the tables
- fill out a name tag
- get a tray full of pull tabs
- ask the pull tab captain (check sign up sheet) any questions you have about the pull tabs
- get starter money from the banker at the table (to make change when selling pull tabs)
- walk around shout out the pull tab names you are selling (except during a coverall) you will know when to be quiet
- people will signal they want to buy, this usually happens by them shouting BANKER, or your name, or the name of the pull tab, snapping, clapping, trying to hand you money
- each pull tab is \$1
- count out what they want, collect money, provide change

- if someone shouts BINGO! and you are near them, ensure the Bingo caller has heard them, walk over to the person who has shouted bingo and raise your hand and ensure the caller sees you. The caller will tell you to go ahead and you will read the number out loud to the caller that is in the middle of the winning bingo sheet. They will confirm it's a good bingo. Show that bingo sheet to a person at the table next to you to confirm the number you called out (bingo law). Then you collect the money from the paymaster. Deliver it to the winner and count it out TWICE to ensure accuracy.
- you are allowed to collect winning pull tabs and treat them as cash. Turn those in to the front table when you need to get more pull tabs or refresh your money supply.
- any further questions can be directed to the bingo table
- get your free drinks, soda, water, beer, white claw
- get your free food, pizza, subs, hot dogs
- people watch
- get your steps in
- head home around 9:30ish

BLESSED ALEXADRINA MARIA DA COSTA

PORTUGAL, 1904-1955

Alexadrina remained paralyzed at age 21 from a dramatic incident in which she fled from the threat of violence. She did not permit herself to be overcome by sadness and by loneliness, but thought: "Jesus, You are a prisoner in the tabernacle as I am here on my bed, so that we can keep company". Following the physical sufferings from the paralysis, mystical sufferings were added: for four years, every Friday she saw the sorrows of the Passion, and after this period, for another 13 years until her death she was nourished only by the Eucharist. Her life became a continuous prayer for the conversion of sinners.

On her tomb are the words she wished to be placed there: "Sinners, if the ashes of my body can be useful for your salvation, draw near to them, pass above them, and trample on them until they vanish. But sin no more; do not offer our Jesus any longer!"

Alexandrina Maria was born in Balasar, Portugal on March 30, 1904. At age 14, in order to escape an attack by three men and to maintain her purity, she jumped from the window, but did not escape without suffering injury. The consequences were terrible, if not immediate. In fact, several years later, she became bedridden from a progressively increasing paralysis, from which she suffered for the remaining 30 years of her life. Yet, she did not despair, but entrusted herself to Jesus with these words: "As you are a prisoner in the tabernacle and I am a prisoner on my bed for doing Your will, so we can keep ourselves company". As a result, she began to live through ever more powerful mystical experiences, and from Friday, October 3, 1938 until March 24, 1942, for up to 182 times, she relived the sufferings of the Passion. Beginning in 1942 until her death, Alexandrina was fed only by the Eucharist, and

during a period of convalescence at the Foco del Douro Hospital near Oporto, for forty days and forty nights she was under supervision by several doctors in her absolute fast and her condition of *anuria* (absence of urine). After 10 long years of paralysis which she had offered as Eucharistic reparation for the conversion of sinners, on July 30, 1935, Jesus appeared to her saying: "I have put you in the world so that you may draw life only from Me, to bear witness to the world how precious the Eucharist is. [...]"

"The strongest chain that keeps souls in bondage *vigil* Satan is the flesh and the sins of impurity. Never has there been such a spread of vices, wickedness and crimes as there is today! Never has there been so much sin [...]" The Eucharist - My Body and Blood - Behold, the


Eucharist is the salvation of the world." Mary also appeared to her on September 12, 1949, with the Rosary in her hand, saying to her "The world is in agony and is dying in sin. My desire is for prayer, my desire is for penance. I have protected with this, my Rosary, all those whom I love and the whole world." On October 13, 1955, the anniversary of the last apparition of the Blessed Mother at Fatima, Alexandrina was heard exclaiming: "I am happy, for I am on my way to heaven." She died at 7:30 in the evening on that very day.
