Dear Parents.

Today marks the middle of our 4th Quarter. It is hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the year! Teachers should be updating grades by the end of the day today so please take a minute to check Sycamore this weekend. This week our 7th grade students received 1st Aid training and our 8th grade students received CPR/AED training from the Elsmere Fire Department. If there is a crisis, they are trained and prepared to help! Today our 2nd grade students are having their Jesus Day in preparation for their 1st Communion, which will take place on May 4. Please keep them in your prayer!

The Pop Tab Wars came to an end with our third graders collecting 97,142 tabs, followed by eighth grade with 54,807, and sixth grade taking third with 44,607 tabs. Grand total: 405,999 tabs collected! The question is, where did all those tabs come from?? Thanks to the Staley family for coordinating the tab collection this year. With the tabs collected almost \$100 was donated to the Ronald McDonald House to provide housing for the families of children who are being treated on a long-term basis at Cincinnati Children's Hospital.

Speaking of collections, our CRS Rice Bowl collection was over \$890! Thanks to our 6th grade students for spearheading this program with regular announcements and counting the donations that were turned in! CRS Rice Bowl provides funding to projects throughout the world that help support people who are living in poverty by teaching them skills and providing resources that can help them break the cycle of poverty.

Next week is a short week, due to it being Holy Week and the beginning of Spring Break. Please note that school will be closed from Thursday, April 17- Friday, April 25. Today at Mass Fr. Lang,e walked our students through the different days of Holy Week and their significance. We hope you will be able to join us for some of the Triduum services. They are some of the most beautiful services of the Church year and are packed with significance for our faith!

Our Derby Night fundraiser is tomorrow evening. If you have not purchased your tickets yet it is not too late! You can still register and if you can't attend you can still bid on silent auction items or purchase split the pot tickets. The pot is up to \$16,620 and is still rising! You can also purchase a week-long out of uniform pass for your students! More information on that is coming home today.

Tuition rates for next year are now available on ourwebsite. As was communicated earlier this week,

based off of the feedback we received from parents, we will be moving forward with hiring an SRO for the 2025-2026 school year. There will be an additional fee assessed to help cover that cost. The fee will not be more than \$103 and will most likely be less as we continue to receive registrations for next year. The exact fee amount will be in your tuition statement.

25 things for your kids to spot during Palm Sunday and Triduum



Technically, Triduum spans three days—from the evening of Holy Thursday until the evening of Easter Sunday—but liturgically, it is "one day," one long celebration of the Paschal Mystery. Triduum culminates in the Easter Vigil, which is the high point of the entire liturgical year. As with the Sunday liturgy, reviewing what will happen at the liturgy in advance is a good way to help your kids participate with understanding and reverence.







